By the Virtue of this Writ in Form within written, I came to the Court within written, and in that full Court I have caused to be recorded the Plea within written ; and that Record (as appears in a Schedule to this Writ annex'd) I have (ready) before the Justices within written, at the Day and Place within contained ; and I have prefix'd the same Day to the Parties within written, that they be then there to proceed in that Plea, as shall be just, as I am within command:d.

And note, If the Return be thus. *At my Court held, &c. I have caused the Plea to be Recorded, which is in the same Court, before me. This is not good, for the Suitors are the Judges there, and not the Sheriff ; and therefore, the Stile of the Court must be before the Stewards of the Court, and not before me. Also the Schedule annexed, must be — at my Court, held (such a Day and Year) before (such and such) Suitors of the Court ; and not before me.*

And in a Recordari the Sheriff may return a *Tarde* (as above) and on a Complaint of Beasts

or Cattle taken he may Return, *That the Cause* (of taking, &c.) *is not True, &c.*

These Returns above recited, sufficiently shew the Form of Returns on Writs of *Accedas*, false Judgment, *Pone* and *Recordari*; which are usually directed to inferior Courts and Jurisdictions as aforesaid. But there are other Writs, which tho' of the like Nature and Form with those directed to Sheriffs of Counties, yet when they are to be executed in *Counties Palatine*, must be executed and returned by other Officers, and in another Manner than those directed to Sheriffs.

Returns of Writs to Counties Palatine.

Of this Nature is a *Capias* or *Attachment*, &c. to be executed in the *County Palatine of Chester*, &c. which is in this Form.

P. of the Debt and Damages within specified, as within I am commanded; by Virtue of which Warrant, they the said J. B. and P. But note; It has been held, that on a *Capias ad Satisfaciendum* or other Writ of Execution, the Sheriff cannot legally return a Rescue, and that he shall be amerced if he makes such a Return. For he is to bring in the Body at his Peril, if it be in Time of Peace, and to that End may raise the *Posse comitatus*; and besides, he may have his Writ of Rescue, (or an Action on the Case to that Effect) wherein he shall recover (in Damages) as much as he was amerced, &c. See *Fitzh. Abr. Return*, 110. And yet if the Party was rescued by *unknown Persons*, there the Return is good; for then it doth not appear that he can have any Action or Remedy over. See *ibid.* and *Dalt. Sher.* 110.

Note; Whereas in the foregoing List, some Towns, &c. are said to be the King's, and others expressly said to be other Persons; but the greater Number mention neither: We are to understand that all such Towns, as were the Antient Demeasns of the Crown, were named *Villæ Regis*, and such as were the Demeasns of other Lords were named accordingly, but all the antient Burrows of the Kingdom being free, could not properly be said to be the Burrs. of the King or any other Lord: For as all *Villæ* or Towns were either the King's or some other Lord's Demeasns, so their Inhabitants were generally *Villani* or *Villeins*, to do and pay at their Lords Pleasure, and therefore could not chuse their own Magistrates, nor be represented in Parliament. On the contrary, the Burrows of the Kingdom originally imported Freedom; they were all *Liberi Burgi*, and their Inhabitants *Liberi Bargeses*. But when King John and other Princes, on valuable Considerations, erected such Villis or Towns into Burrows, tho' the Inhabitants thereby purchased their Freedom, yet the Stile of his or our Town was thence Transferr'd to that of his or our Burrow.
